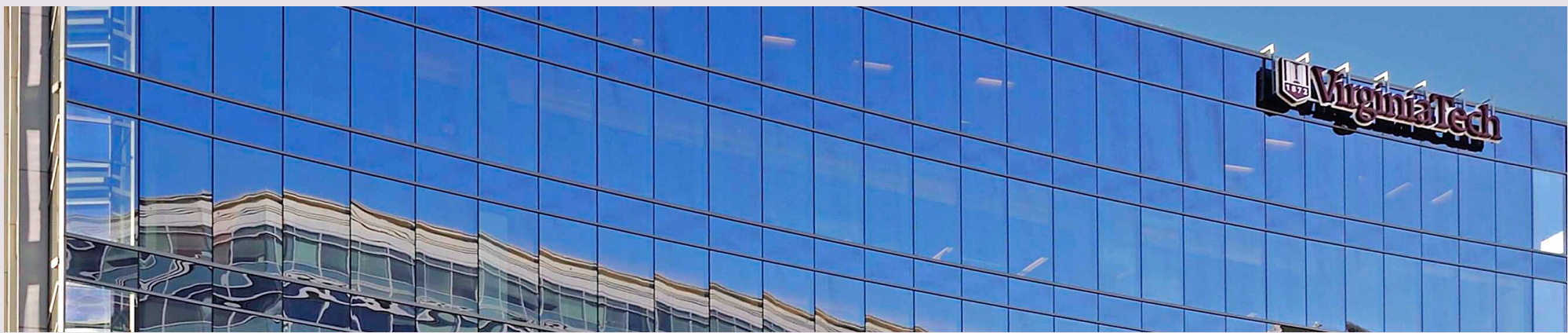

VT SPIA @ ARLINGTON

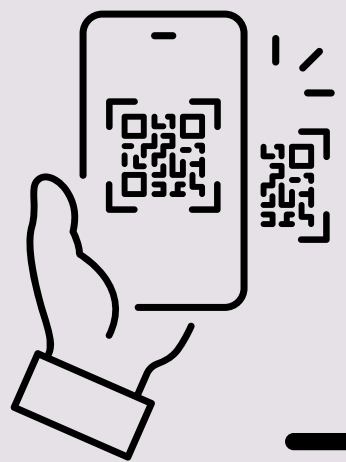
